"Swish!"

"That wasn't a swish! It didn't even go in!"

Matthew laughs as he retrieves the basketball from the lawn and rushes back to the court to take his shot. David laughs too and shrugs, admitting without speaking that his shot didn't really make it into the basket. "Eighteen to sixteen to... how many do you have, Ashley?"

Ashley gets up from the bench where she had taken a very brief break to have a drag on a cigarette with the other two kids who are watching the game.

"I don't know, ten or eleven or something."

She takes a pass from Matthew and sets her eyes on the basket.

The exact score matters less than the participation, being a part of not only the game, but of a distracting moment away from Ontario Works paperwork, web searches for apartments, and the difficulty of trying to finish school while doing all these other things.

The backyard at Our Place Peel is large. It's big enough for a basketball court, an apple

tree, and a wild, wild garden with room left over for lots of lawn. As a volunteer, I find the backyard a good place to spend the two hours I'm at OPP on a weekday evening. The youth don't always suggest going outside; they don't always know each other very well and might not feel comfortable proposing a basketball game. I can take this upon myself. It keeps me active and keeps them active and allows for a different kind of interaction than sitting inside chatting. But as the days grow shorter and the leaves grow colourful, the basketball court grows less and less inviting. The time has come for playing cards around the table in the warm kitchen.

"Owe, fingernails!"

Maria chuckles. "Jess, your fingernails are so sharp!"

Spoons is a card game in which sharp fingernails can come into contact with the soft flesh of the backs of hands. Dinner spoons are put on the table, always one less than the number of players, and when certain conditions are met in the card game, everyone must grab a spoon. The player who doesn't get a spoon loses. It is a vibrant and fast paced game and is very popular at OPP, even if you might need a band-aid after playing.

"I always lose! I hate playing spoons! I'm always last place!"

Jamira claims to hate playing spoons, but the number of smiles she flashes while doing it and the laugh she gives as she says this suggests otherwise. That she "always" loses suggests that she has seen her share of spoons games at OPP. "Always" losing might just offer Jamira a brief moment of stability in what for her is a very unstable time in her life. OPP can give her that and I am happy to be a part of it.

enhancement update

Our Place Peel is pleased to announce the Region of Peel and the Homelessness Partnering Strategy's recently approved funding for the development our Emergency Youth Shelter.

The project will see the enhancement and expansion of Our Place Peel's emergency youth shelter operations in Peel while addressing the issue of undesirable types of youth behaviour along with the limited capacity of the existing shelter building and in the community at large.

The project proposes to reconfigure the shelter within the existing building to provide six (6) new transitional beds that would meet the needs of youth who need to stay longer than the three week period currently available. These beds would be used by youth requiring a stay of approx. one to three months. These youth would ideally come from the emergency shelter population which would free up more shelter beds to meet emergency accommodation needs and reduce the number of youth that are turned away due to lack of capacity. Currently, our average monthly capacity ranges from 85 to 100%.

Overall, Our Place Peel's goal is to increase and improve services to strengthen the continuum of care to achieve more effective results for homeless youth in Peel, while providing a safe, secure, stable and home-like setting. The aim is to:

- Reduce the number of youth who we turn away due to capacity limitations
- Reduce the rate of recidivism among the youth who use our services
- Increase the quality and quantity of care we provide to youth seeking our services
- Increase public awareness efforts to youth and to those who find themselves in a position to refer youth to our services as an education and prevention strategy
- Create a more conducive space for programming to take place and a more welcoming and productive environment for youth, staff and volunteers

john's story



My name is Jennifer Lema and I am the Resource Counselor at Our Place Peel. Having worked at Our Place Peel for the past 6 years I have been privileged to be a small part in the success and growth of many youth. I would like to tell you about a youth whose story doesn't quite fit into the mould of what we would traditionally look at as success. John came to the shelter for the first time in the fall of 2009. Like most of our youth, John's story was sad and he was trying to make a fresh start in life. It did not take staff long to recognize John as an intelligent young man who was full of potential.

Unfortunately, it also didn't take staff long to recognize a definite lack of motivation on John's part as it related to improving his situation. Over the past year, I have witnessed as John has come to Our Place Peel time and again. Each time, our staff has done their best to work with John to help him set goals and to work towards them. Yet, each time we have seen John put forth a minimal amount of effort and eventually discovered that his approved time at Our Place Peel had expired or that he had done something to warrant an early discharge. As a staff, we can set behavioural and case plan related guidelines for John. We can ensure that while he is a resident of Our Place Peel we allow him to see what his life could look like. What we cannot do is take the steps needed to achieve his goals for him. That part is up to John.

One of the hardest parts of this job is to not lose hope that John and the many youth like John will one day pick themselves up and work toward a better future. I believe that one of the greatest responsibilities we have to these youth is to be there for them each time they are need, because you never know what word of encouragement or word of reprimand will be the thing that finally gets through. Thankfully, Our Place Peel is an agency that believes in second chances, and third chances, and fourths and however many it takes.
